Four seasons gardening program offers fall series

Four Seasons gardening program offers fall series

The fall series of University of Illinois Extension's Four Seasons Gardening program, which focuses on environmental stewardship, home gardening, and backyard food production, is underway this month. The first session of the series is titled, "Mysterious Modifications: Plants That Grow in Unusual Ways." The program is offered on Sept. 27, at 1:30 p.m. and again on Sept. 29, at 6:30 p.m. This webinar may be viewed from the comfort of your home on a computer.

Anyone who delves into gardening or nature comes across a plant that mystifies them in how it has adapted to the environment it relies on. From the insect eating carnivorous plants that grow in bogs to the invasive plants that poison the soil to fend off competition, some plants are truly wondrous. University of Illinois Extension Horticulture Educator, Kelly Allsup, will reveal

some unique plants we deal with while giving you the newest and latest research on them.
